If you pay your current dues during the restoration then you will not have to pay an initiation fee upon the reopening of the course. Your dues will be frozen at your current category and rate through Sept 2026. Additionally, each member will be furnished with a Paradise Card which has discounted golf rates at courses throughout the Greater Tampa area. The pro shop will also negotiate the best rate possible for you at local clubs that are helping out during the closure. Members will also be able to hit free range balls at the Stirling Park Range during the course restoration

Members that choose not to pay their dues during the course restoration will be subject to the new initiation fees, dues, and member cap upon rejoining Dunedin Golf Club

Membership Cap 275 comprised of Active single and family, Young Adult single and family

Membership waiting list \$100 refundable to get on the waiting list. There are 2 lists, one for Residents, Property Owners, Business owners in Dunedin and one for Non-Residents. The Dunedin waiting list must be empty before the Non-Resident list is used. When your name comes up, if you turn down the opportunity your name will go to the end of the list

The following categories will no longer be offered:

9 Hole: 9 Hole members that continue paying dues will have their dues frozen through Sept 2026. After that date they will pay the prevailing rate, which will be approx. the same % of Active Member dues

Seasonal: Seasonal members that paid dues in the 2022-2023 season or the 2023-2024 season are eligible to remain as members for the 2024-2025 season and beyond at the prevailing rates as long as they continue every year.

Tee Times will be available 10 days prior for Members 7 days prior for Public play Historic Block Times MGA, LGA, Owls, Penguins etc will be honored as closely as possible. Maximum 6 tee times. We ask each group to assign a leader that will communicate to the golf shop 3 days prior regarding how many times their group will fill.

Frequently asked questions:

Regarding practice at Stirling Park, how many balls can we hit.

Members remaining and paying dues can hit as many balls as they like during restoration of the course. We will furnish you a member card that identifies you to the Stirling Park staff. The free range ball offer is for the remaining member only.

What happens if the construction runs longer than planned

If the construction runs longer than planned due to something the City could recover liquidated damages for, then your Sept 2026 freeze will extend by that amount. Construction runs 1 month longer due to contractor error then your freeze would extend through Oct 2026

If construction were to run 6 months longer not due to contractor error but due to 3 hurricanes, and any other reason then that bridge will be crossed when it happens. Notwithstanding the cart shed, the City has a good track record on projects and getting them done on time.

I want to upgrade from Single to Family when we reopen

To upgrade from Single to Family you would need to pay the initiation fee difference (resident or non-resident) and the new family dues.
